Note from Colin Mountford (Aug 2001):

May I respectfully draw to your attention that the two documents [JJ/1 & JJ/2] are incorrectly titled, in that they have on their spines references to "James Joicey & Co". This title is not found until about 1873, and then became James Joicey & Co Ltd on 8th January 1886. At the time that these documents were being created the owner of the collieries concerned was simply James Joicey, though he clearly sometimes used the trading title of "The Owner of XXXX Colliery". According to the partnership documents still held by Lord Joicey at Etal, James did not go into partnership with his brother John until 8th January 1850.
